FIRST LESSON

1 Corinthians 12:12-21, 24b-27

For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and we were all made to drink of one Spirit. Indeed, the body does not consist of one member but of many. If the foot would say, "Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. And if the ear would say, "Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be? If the whole body were hearing, where would the sense of smell be? But as it is, God arranged the members in the body, each one of them, as he chose. If all were a single member, where would the body be? As it is, there are many members, yet one body. The eye cannot say to the hand, "I have no need of you," nor again the head to the feet, "I have no need of you." But God has so arranged the body, giving the greater honor to the inferior member, that there may be no dissension within the body, but the members may have the same care for one another. If one member suffers, all suffer together with it; if one member is honored, all rejoice together with it.

He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and

The Corinthians, to whom Paul writes this passage, have divided themselves not only around loyalty to certain leaders, and around social status, but also around spiritual gifts such as gifts for prophecy, speaking in tongues, performing miracles, and so on. Paul uses the metaphor of one body with many members to argue that everyone, regardless of specific giftedness, is indispensable to the whole.

The Presbyterian Home for Children, located in Talladega, AL, was established in 1868, initially as an orphanage. For the last 150 years they have provided for children in need and their families in a variety of ways. The PHfC is a 501©3 governed by a Board of Trustees elected in part by the three Presbyteries of Alabama. First Presbyterian Huntsville has a long relationship with the PHfC having had members serve on the board, sending volunteers down to work at the Home, many youth work trips, financial assistance, and hosting children from the Home at Maranatha.

The PHfC has several ministries currently:

- **Secure Dwellings** provides transitional housing for homeless children and their female caregivers, while assisting those caregivers towards becoming self-sufficient.
- **Transition to Adult Living** helps young women ages 19-24 with housing and group and individualized training to transition to independent living.
- Moderate Residential Care provides residential care for children with special behavioral or educational needs.
- Hope Academy and Ascension Leadership Academy provides educational services.
- **Family Bridges** provides intensive in-home services for families in need.

On October 27 we will travel to Talladega to help with their fundraiser, The Children's Home Challenge. This is a bike ride fundraiser with routes from 5 to 100 miles. We will man one of the rest stops, handing out food, water, and encouragement to the bike riders. This is an intergenerational event. Children 6th grade and up may come without a parent. Younger children may still participate if a parent comes as well. Our children and youth will also be making posters ahead of time to decorate our rest stop.
